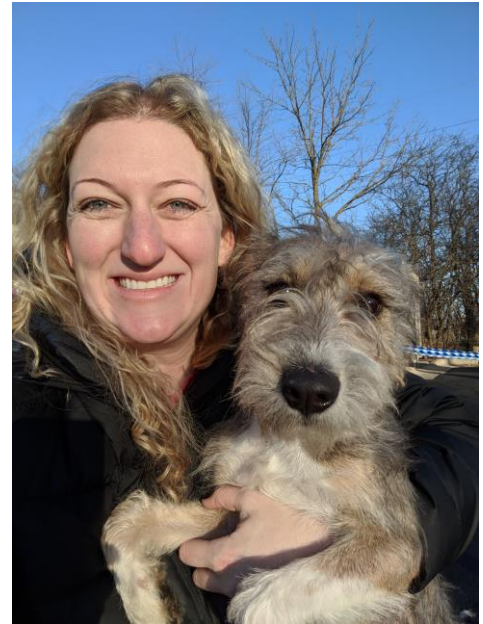


Meet the 2018 HSVMA Compassionate Care Scholarship Recipients

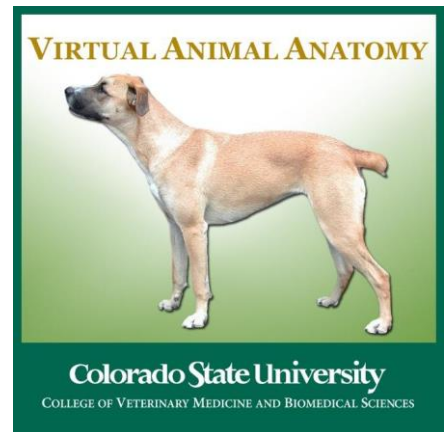
Become a Rover Sitter and Benefit HSVMA

Colorado State University's Virtual Anatomy Programs are Available Again!

For more than 15 years, Colorado State University's Veterinary Education Tools (VET) team has been creating Virtual Animal Anatomy software to help improve educational experiences for students and reduce excess cadaver use in teaching. Virtual Canine Anatomy (VCA) is an innovative anatomy program that has received outstanding accolades from members of the American Association of Veterinary Anatomists, students, and instructors both in the United States and internationally. VCA enhances the students' dissection experience and helps them learn anatomy efficiently ([Linton, Schoenfeld-Tacher, Whalen, 2005](#)). In addition, programs for Virtual Equine Anatomy (VEA), Virtual Bovine Anatomy (VBA), and Virtual Feline Anatomy (VFA) are in development.
